As we work to increase our stability, we are looking for ways to increase or create new programs to support our mission. TIP "Joe Alexander" Officer of the Year

As you may know, TIP is not managed or operated under the Minnesota DNR, nor are we supported by them financially. We are, however, a partnership that would not happen without the work of our Conservation Officers. Each year, TIP elects one officer to receive the prestigious "Joe Alexander - Officer of the Year" award. The nominations come from their peers and recognize the officer's commitment, diligence in working with TIP complaints, and support through TIP fundraising and education. This year's selection is Kipp Duncan out of the Northeast region. Kipp is a longstanding Conservation Officer with years of service to the TIP organization as well as the citizens of Minnesota. He works very closely with local groups and the public to promote, educate, and enhance the TIP program. Please help us congratulate him on receiving the award.



The December Annual Membership Meeting Highlights are:

- Board changes: Bob Mlyner and Dustin Miller, were elected to the board. We did have one board member resign for personal reasons. We want to thank Brandon Nadeau for his years of service.
- Executive Board elections: President, Peter Lodermeier; Vice-president, Carl Fugleberg; Sec./Treasurer, Diane Britton
- Operational review: In early 2017 staffing decreased from 2 part-time staff to 1; insurance needs were reviewed with carrier; financial review with approval of 2018 budget; membership expiration changes were reviewed and approved.
- DNR report from Jon Paurus, liaison: the year's activity report was reviewed; discussion on trailer tracking devices; membership in the International Wildlife Crimestoppers; use of TIP envelopes for CO's in the field
- Understanding the membership expiration changes: In the past, TIP's membership was based on the month in which a person joined or renewed. From the standpoint of record keeping and tracking, it is difficult to complete. After review and discussion by the board, it was decided to have an annual membership in a calendar year rather than fiscal year. This will allow us to do an annual membership drive one time per year with volunteer help. Tracking and maintenance will be much easier and better organized.

The Two Harbors Bucks

While attending the Duluth Sportsman's Show and Deer Classic, I had the opportunity to discuss a local case in Two Harbors that gained



much attention. It generates much emotion in terms of the ethics of deer hunting.
